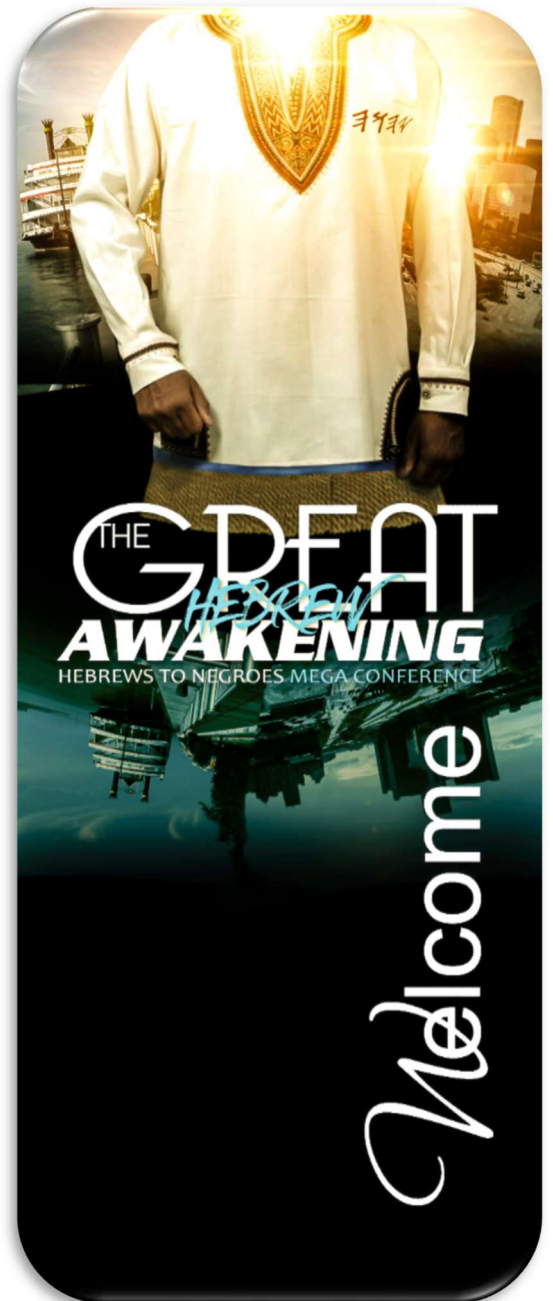

GENERAL INFORMATION

Great Awakening is dedicated to hosting local, regional, national, and international events to awaken, educate, and update the disperse of Israel on trends and issues related to the rapidly growing Hebrew community through sharing information on research, educational opportunities, regional resources, new communities, prophetic events, community issues, and trends.

And he shall set up an ensign for the nations, and shall assemble the outcasts of Israel, and gather together the dispersed of Judah from the four corners of the earth.” – Isaiah 11:11-12

The Great Awakening: Hebrews to Negroes Mega Conference to be held in Detroit, MI, 11 – 14 July 2019, will bring together people from all settings who are awakened to or curious about their Hebrew Identity with the objective of building unity and strengthening relationships between the Hebrew community and the business, academic, social, political and faith sectors to enhance their roles in the awakening movement. The Conference includes Hebrew to Negroes Movie: Revelation, a Panel Discussion, nearly 20 workshops, a Hebrew Musical, 300 plus Hebrews in Intercessory Prayer, a Unity Sabbath Service, an All-White Party Boat Cruise, a Banquet and Award Ceremony, a Lake Baptism, and an Old-school style Family Cookout.

The Great Awakening: Hebrews to Negroes Mega Conference 2019 convenes awakened persons, spiritual practitioners, educators, community leaders and some of the world’s most sought after thought speakers on this subject at the Cobo Convention Center Downtown Detroit for a weekend of exploration in the areas of education, leadership, character building, professional development, worship, fellowship, opportunities, and networking connections that enables a culture of collaboration. More than 300 Hebrews and their families will travel to Detroit this July to gain access to opportunities that only this unique conference can offer.

Conference Objectives:

1. To support the conference focus, “The Great Awakening”, by providing attendees with practical knowledge and tools that they can use to continue to awaken the dispersed of Israel.

2. To raise awareness about how African Americans and other Bantus Negroes around the world are fulfilling biblical prophecy by rediscovering their ancient identity
3. To showcase diversity in the Hebrew culture across diverse factions and settings
4. To support networking and sharing among Hebrews (African Americans) from all settings within the business, entertainment, academic, political and faith continuum.
5. To continue to build the momentum and celebrate the culture of the Hebrew community in the US and beyond.
6. To highlight the people, assemblies, organizations, and education in advancing the Hebrew movement.

Conference Goals:

1. increases awareness of, knowledge about, and appreciation for issues unique to African American who have discovered their Hebraic roots.
2. seeks to educate and update African Americans on trends and issues related to the rapidly growing Hebrew community through sharing information on research, educational opportunities, regional resources, new communities, prophetic events, community issues, and trends.

Conference Program Elements

The conference program will consist of workshop sessions that:

1. Reflect elements of the black community, both within the Hebrew setting and within the community at large, and how this impacts the culture of people of color,
2. Include practical tools for implementation of person-centered practices, providing attendees with what they need to implement what they learn.
3. Reflect the knowledge and experiences of those who work on the frontline of the Hebrew movement and who are engaged in living these practices every day.
4. Are inclusive, ensuring diverse voices are represented and supported in planning and delivery. The conference program will include the voices of Hebrew leaders and engage people of all ages in sharing and exploring what it means to reconnect to historical roots.
5. Are interactive and experiential, providing a safe and engaging space where participants actively engage with ideas and have opportunities for critical reflection and dialogue with each other. The program will welcome vibrant, creative and non-traditional approaches to share information (e.g., use of technology, performing arts, fine arts, media, narratives, poetry, photography, small art installations, etc.), in addition to more traditional panel presentations followed by facilitated discussion.
6. Build linkages by creating opportunities for strong connections to be made between lived experiences

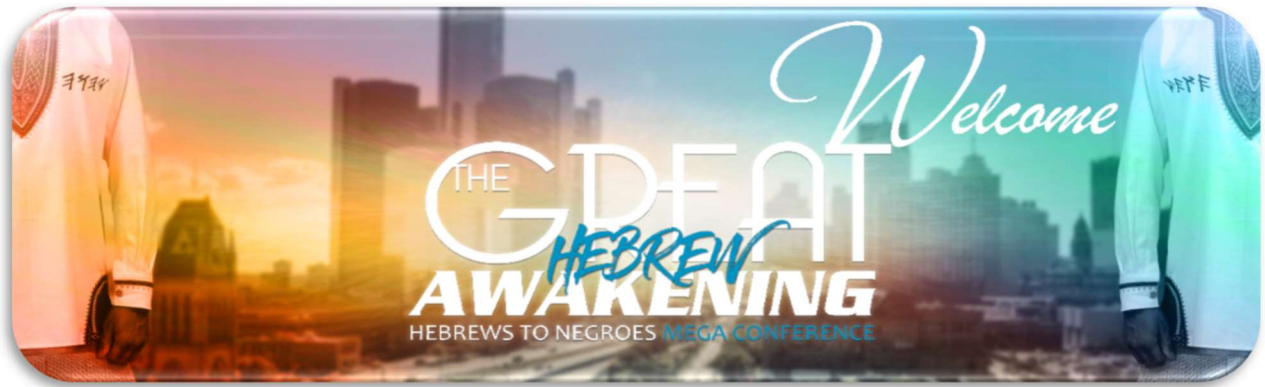

BADGES & WRISTBANDS



Guest Badges are designated for Keynote Speakers, Workshop Speakers, and Concert Guests. The Guest Badge is an all-access pass for Keynote and Guest Speakers to all of the events during the Conference. Concert Guests will have limited access (No Movie or Banquet) unless stated in the contract.



Staff Badges are designated for Staff/Organizing Members of the Conference. The Staff Badge is an all-access pass to all events.



Vendor Badges are designated for Vendors. Vendor Guests will have limited access (No Movie or Banquet) unless they are wearing an blue or white wristband which will allow them to gain access into the Movie and Banquet.



Volunteer Badges are designated for Volunteers. Volunteers Guests will have access to the Workshops, Concert, Shabbat Service, and Cookout with limited access (No Movie or Banquet) unless they pay these events or are wearing an blue or white wristband which will allow them to gain access into the Movie and Banquet.

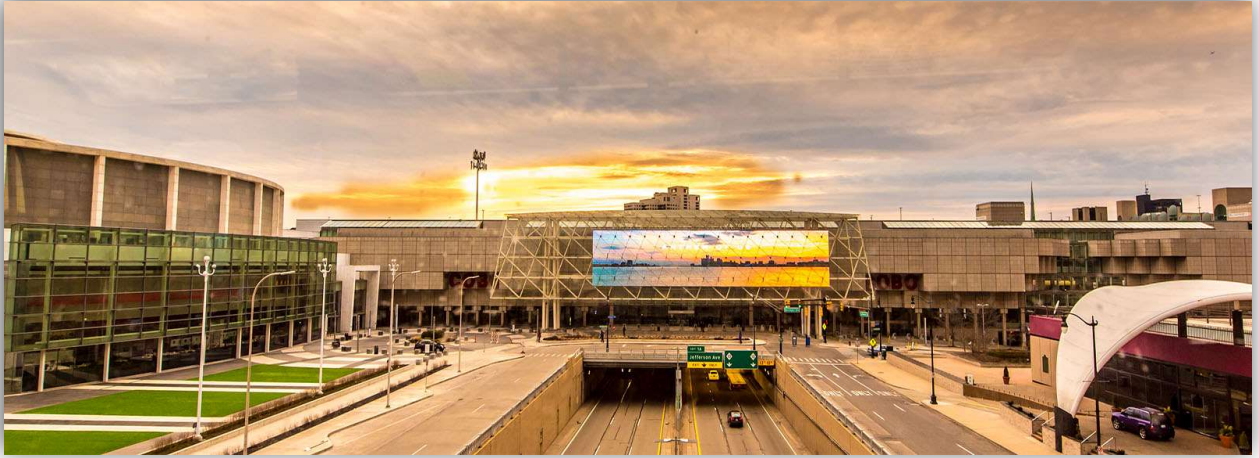

COBO CONVENTION CENTER



The 2019 Great Awakening Hebrews to Negroes Mega Conference will be held at the Cobo Convention Center 1 Washington Blvd. Detroit, MI 48225 in the beautiful Downtown Detroit.

Cobo Center is the 17th largest convention center in the United States. Built by the City of Detroit, it was originally opened in 1960 and named Cobo Hall in honor of former Detroit Mayor Albert E. Cobo (1950-1957).

Today, Cobo Center is managed and operated by the Detroit Regional Convention Facility Authority (DRCFA). The five-member Authority Board consists of one representative from each of five government agencies – the City of Detroit, State of Michigan and the three metro-Detroit counties of Wayne, Oakland and Macomb. In October 2010, the DRCFA awarded the contract for operations management of Cobo Center to SMG, the world leader in venue management, marketing and development.

- 225,000 square feet of breakout and meeting space including 100 meeting rooms
- Lobby coffee/wine bar
- Interior flex spaces for work/lounge/networking
- Outdoor terraces for flex space use
- Overhead rigging capacity on 10' grid

- An in-house broadcast studio with video editing, and facility-wide fiber network
- An extensive video board communication system throughout the facility including two giant exterior boards that provide possible shared revenue opportunities for events
- High-end food & beverage presentation capability
- International access: US Port of Entry – Tunnel to Canada two blocks from the facility
- Detroit riverfront location

- Cross Canada direct highway connection to East Coast population centers (Western New York, New England)
- Superior airlift capacity at award-winning Detroit Metro Airport (ranked #1 by many industry analysts)
- Public transport access to downtown shopping attractions and hotels with on-site downtown People Mover station
- Overall campus on the riverfront includes Hart Plaza, making an outdoor festival or special event space easily accessible
- Metro Detroit has experience successfully hosting major events including the Super Bowl, MLB All-Star Game and World Series, and the NCAA Final Four and Frozen Four – all five since 2005! No other city in the US has done that
- Retail shopping provided on the concourse of Cobo Center in the Detroit Shoppe, a non-profit agency selling iconic made-in-Detroit brand merchandise. All proceeds go to local charities

Cobo Center Amenities Include:

- Free Wi-Fi Internet access throughout the building
- Wired Internet access available in all meeting rooms
- People Mover station inside Cobo providing easy access to many hotels and attractions in the downtown area
- 16 sets of escalators located throughout the building to conveniently move attendees from the major function space on the main level to the meeting room levels on the lower, second and third floors
- Cobo Hospitality, located in the main-level Atrium, provides Conference attendees with helpful services such as restaurant reservations, visitor information, shipping and supplies, as well as arranging for airport shuttling
- Food establishments include a permanent restaurant, a sandwich/ pizza stand and a snack store all inside Cobo; plus numerous restaurants in the downtown area within walking distance

Accessibility

Cobo Center is an Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant center. We make it a priority to welcome and accommodate all guests.

Parking

Parking spaces for the disabled using both regular vehicles and vans are available in each Cobo Center garage.

Wheelchair Availability

Wheelchairs are available upon request. The number of chairs is limited and distributed on a first-come-first-serve basis. If available, wheelchairs can be requested at the concourse Information Desk.

From The Street

The north side of Cobo Center is accessible from the street with elevator access off of Congress Street near the parking garage. The south side of the venue can be accessed from the street

level entrance near the Washington Boulevard turnabout. The Atwater St. entrance provides accessibility to the Atrium and first level. At each accessible entrance there are automatic entry & exit doors along with ADA complaint manual doors.

Walkways, Ramps, Elevators

Ample walkways and ramps are available throughout the center and passenger elevators are located on each level.

Restrooms

Restrooms in Cobo Center are ADA compliant.

Service Animals

Service animals are allowed in Cobo Center but must be credentialed with Cobo Security prior to the event.

Medical Assistance

If you need first aid assistance, please contact the nearest security guard, or police officer. In the event of an emergency, please follow the directions of emergency personnel and staff.

Lactation Stations

Two lactation stations are available in Cobo Center. Access is provided through show management. An ID is required for access to the pods.

How Far is the Airport from Cobo Center?

The Metro Airport is located approximately 22 miles from the Center. You may use a taxi cab or use the link below to make a reservation for Airport Shuttle pick up, service provided by Cobo's transportation partner, [Trinity Transportation](#).

Is Detroit Safe for Attendees?

Cobo Center is an established lighthouse facility in downtown Detroit and [Cobo Security](#) fully collaborates with Project Lighthouse.

The [Downtown Detroit Partnership](#), with its ongoing efforts to provide safety, lighting and code enforcement, and [Project Lighthouse](#), a private public collaboration of business and public safety departments, has created a security force in downtown Detroit that is unique in the nation and equal to none.

The [Downtown Detroit Partnership](#) is a private/public partnership of corporate and civic leaders that supports, advocates and develops programs and initiatives that create a clean, vibrant, safe, beautiful, inviting and economically strong Downtown Detroit community. The public partners are the City of Detroit and the Detroit Economic Growth Corporation. Their Safety, Lighting and Code Enforcement program supports an environment that provides residents, workers and visitors personal safety with: a uniformed presence on downtown streets; an improved perception and realization of public order created by clean streets and sidewalks, well-maintained landscaping, public spaces and streetscape elements; good lighting; elimination of blight using tools such as stringent code enforcement.

Project Lighthouse is a collaboration of all security and law enforcement agencies in the downtown Detroit area including Homeland Security, the US Coast Guard, FBI, Customs and Border Patrol, state, county and city police departments and all private security companies. By leveraging technology resources, information and personnel records, a cooperative surveillance effort exists across the city 24/7/365. This effort creates:

- courtesy patrols in downtown Detroit
- crime mapping and analysis
- a superior camera and video network
- 23 lighthouse facilities established to help people in an emergency

Getting to Cobo

Cobo Center is located right in the heart of downtown Detroit. For your convenience directions can be found below.

Directions

FROM THE NORTH VIA I-75 (CHRYSLER FREEWAY)

- Take I-375 south, exit at westbound Jefferson. Proceed down Jefferson to Cobo Center straight ahead. Stay right to avoid going onto the freeway.
- To park in Cobo Center Garage: Cross Washington Blvd. into garage entrance.
- To park on Cobo Center Roof: Turn right on Washington Blvd. Go two blocks, then left on Congress. Stay right to avoid going onto the freeway. Past Second St., turn left into Cobo Roof Parking

FROM DOWNRIVER VIA I-75 (CHRYSLER FREEWAY)

Exit at M-10 (Lodge Freeway) south, following signs to Civic / Cobo Center.

- To park in Cobo Center Garage: Exit (left exit) at Larned Street. At stop light, turn right on Washington Blvd., then right into garage entrance.
- To park on Cobo Center Roof: Exit at Howard Street and proceed straight until third stop light. Turn left on Fort Street for one block. Turn right on Third Street. Road curves to left, then turn right into Cobo Roof Parking

FROM THE WEST VIA I-96 (JEFFRIES FREEWAY)

- Exit at M-10 (Lodge Freeway) south, following signs to Civic / Cobo Center and following directions above.

FROM I-94 (FORD FREEWAY)

- Take either I-75 or I-96 off of I-94 and follow directions above.

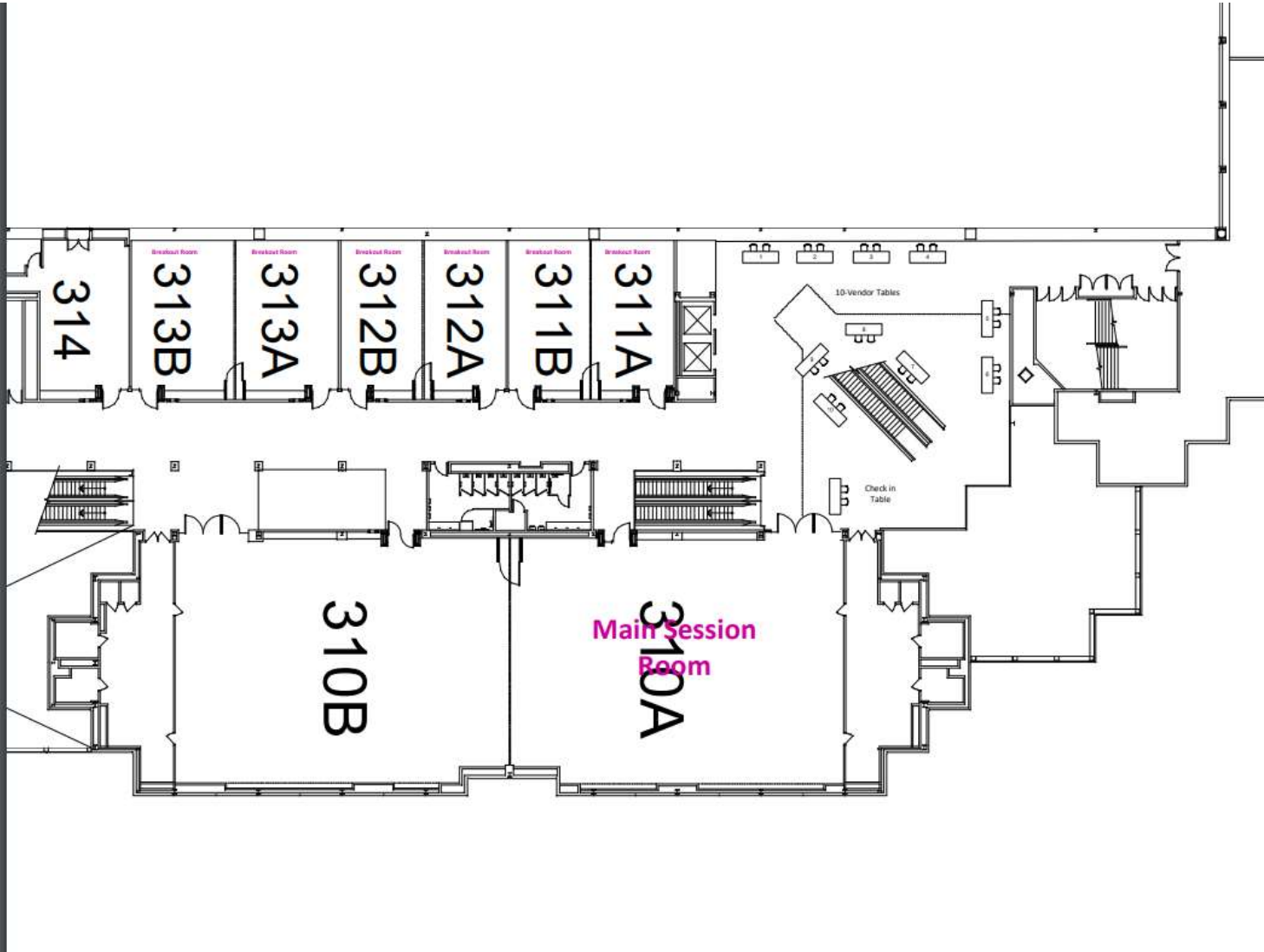

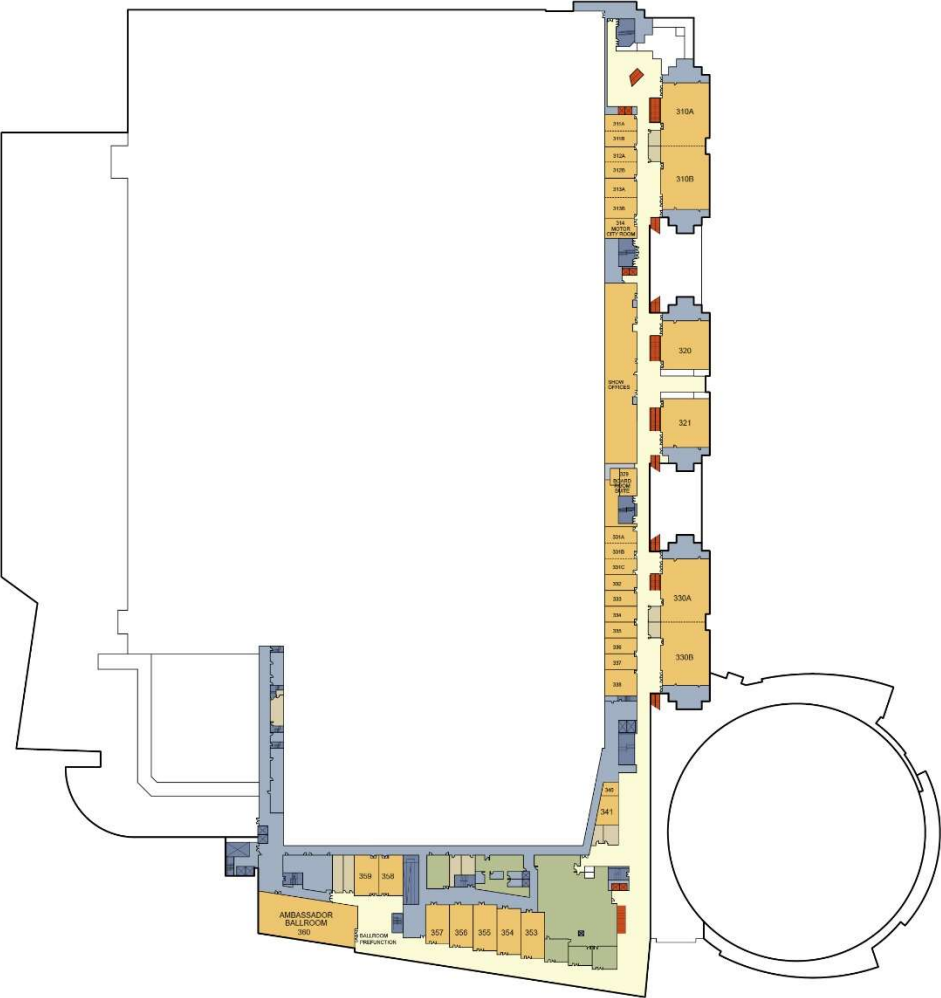


THIRD FLOOR CONFERENCE AREA

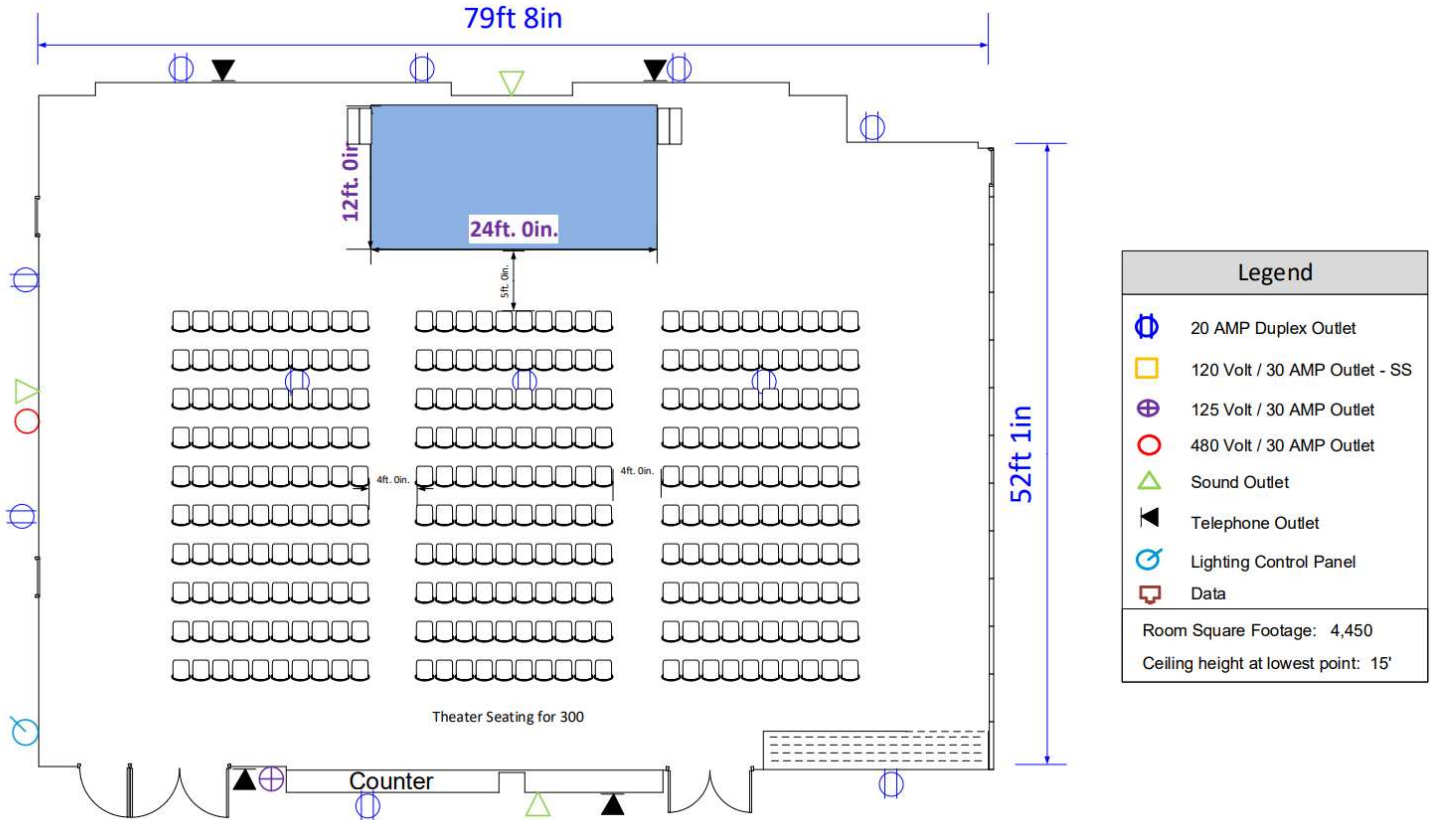

General Session, Sister Circle, Concert, and Shabbat Services held.

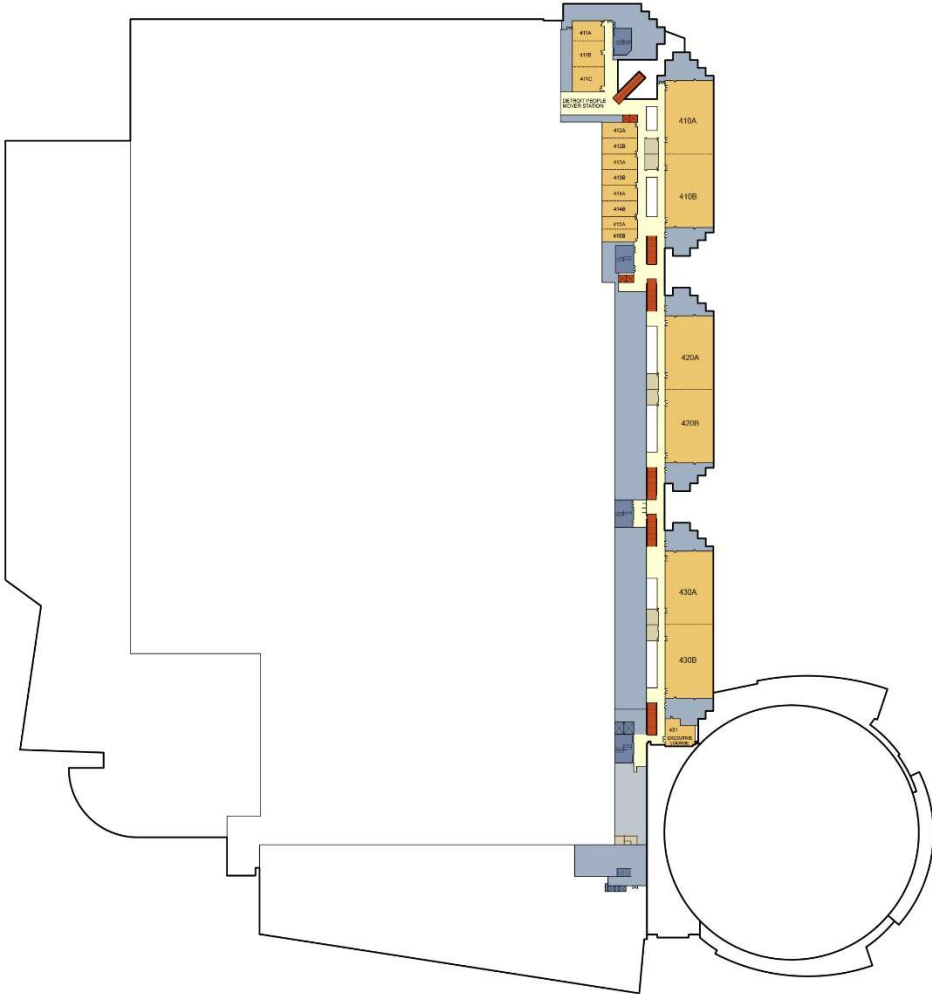

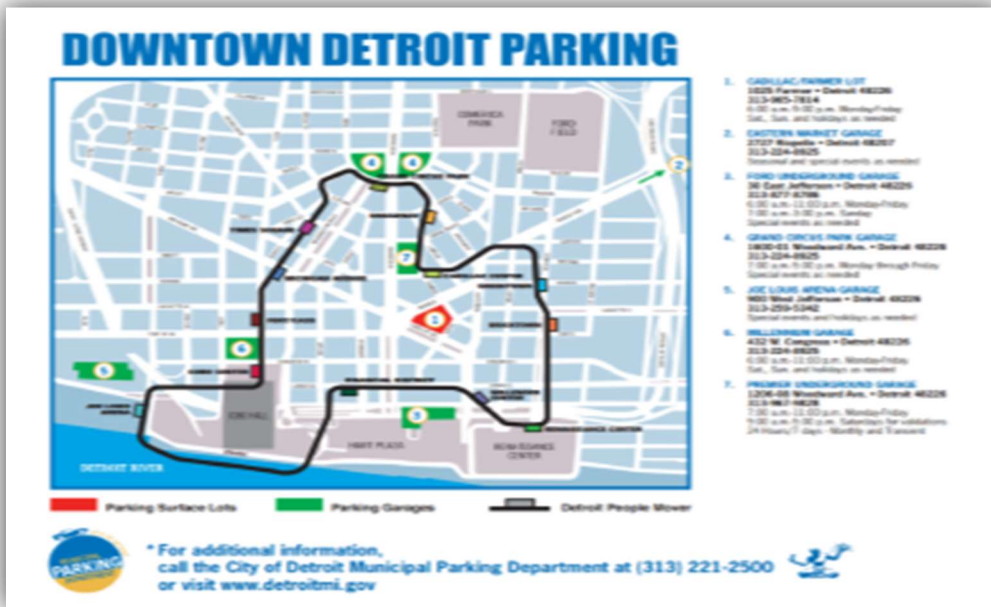

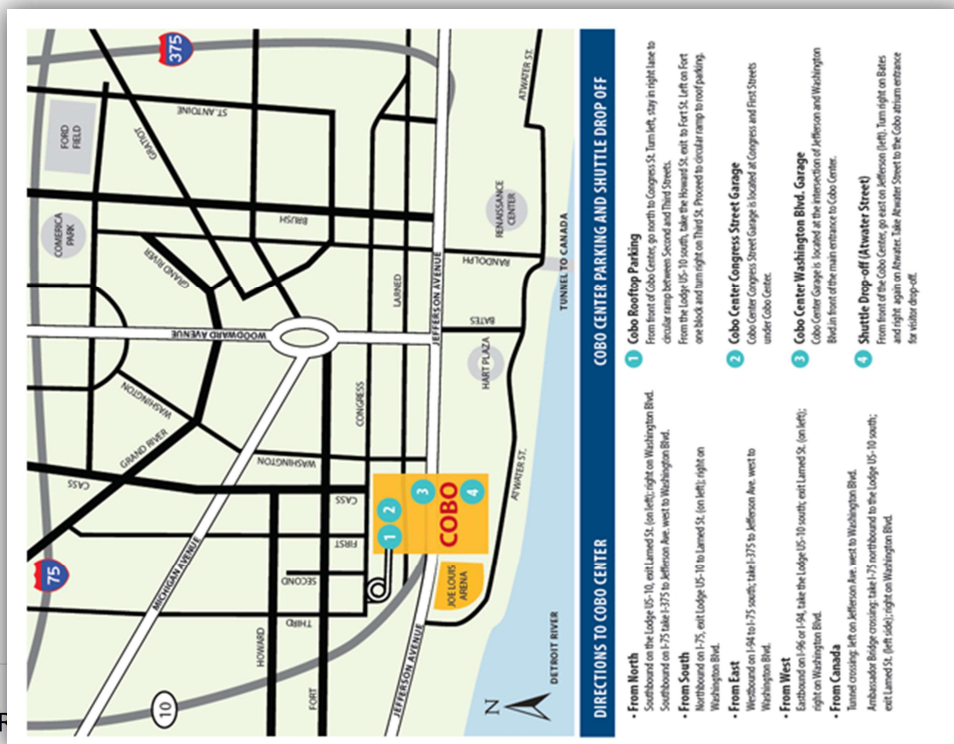
Parking

Currently, Cobo Center has 2,246 parking spaces available for a fee on a first come first serve basis at the Cobo Roof Deck, Washington Blvd., and in the Cobo Center Congress Street Garage. Cobo Center is not responsible for items left in vehicles parked in Cobo Center garages. All parking areas in Cobo Center have handicapped parking spaces and wheelchair accessible facility access. **All Conference attendees are strongly encouraged to park on the Cobo Roof Deck.**

COBO CENTER ROOF DECK PARKING

The Cobo Roof Deck is located at the corner of Congress and Third Streets on the roof of Cobo Center. It features 1,200 uncovered parking spaces, and provides easy access to both Cobo Center and Joe Louis Arena. The Cobo Roof Deck is open Monday-Friday from 6:00 AM - 11:00 PM; hours will vary for weekends and events.

COBO CENTER WASHINGTON BLVD. GARAGE

The Washington Boulevard garage is conveniently located at the corner of Larned St. and Washington Blvd., underneath Cobo Center. This garage features 640 covered parking spaces on two levels. The garage is open Monday-Friday from 6:00 AM - 10:00 PM; hours will vary for weekends and events.

COBO CENTER CONGRESS STREET GARAGE

The Cobo Center Congress Street Garage is located at the intersection of Congress and First streets, underneath the Cobo Center. The Cobo Center Congress Street Garage features 350 covered and 56 uncovered parking spaces. This garage is open only for special events and monthly parking. **The Congress Street Garage is the closest covered parking for Joe Louis Arena events.**

Ground Transportation

A taxi from Detroit Metro Airport to the hotel costs approximately \$50 one-way and takes approximately 30 minutes during non-rush hour and 50 minutes during rush hour.

Downtown Transportation - Detroit People Mover

Once downtown, access COBO, the hotel, restaurants and attractions using the Detroit People Mover . The People mover is a fully automated light rail system that operates on an elevated single track loop in Detroit's central business district. The 2.9 mile system with 13 stops costs .50 cents per ride. Normal weekday operating hours are 6:30 a.m. to Midnight, with an extension to 2 a.m. on Friday. Weekend hours are 9 a.m. to 2 a.m. on Saturday and Noon to Midnight on Sunday. It takes approximately 15 minutes to complete the 13 stop loop. The People Mover, with a station on the 4th floor of Cobo Center, has 13 stops at the most enjoyable parts of the downtown area. At just \$.75 a ride, it pays to plan your excursion.

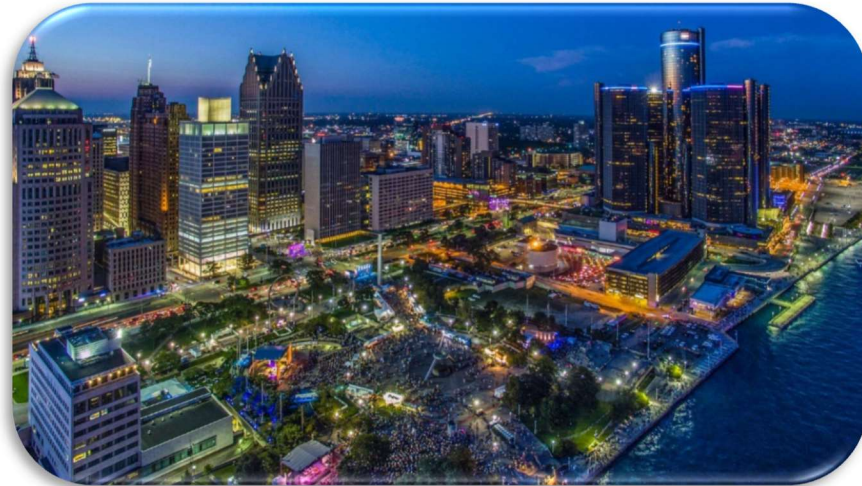

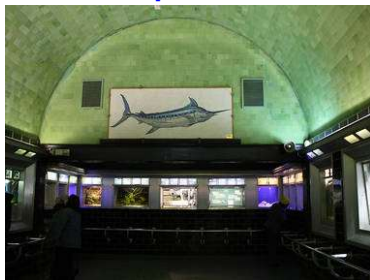

CITY OF DETROIT ATTRACTIONS



The list of the best things to do in Detroit is exhaustive, in all the best ways. Not only does the Motor City ooze history (hello, Motown Record Corporation and Ford Motor Company), but artists, creatives, chefs and the like are busy opening some of the country's best coffee shops, restaurants and bohemian stores. Detroit is also home to fab art museums, trendy markets, some of the best pizza in America and heaps more cool stuff. Check out our list below of the best things to do in Detroit and start planning your next trip to Michigan's largest city.

[Belle Isle Aquarium](#)



River

What is it? One of Detroit's truly historic icons and the oldest public aquarium in the US.

Why go? The Belle Isle Aquarium opened in 1904, and within the ornate building features a single large gallery under an arched, green-tile ceiling, to evoke a spookily-accurate underwater ambience. The aquarium (which also served as a speakeasy during Prohibition) is now run by volunteers and opens every Friday to Sunday, 10am-4pm. If you're heading over to Belle Isle – a 982-acre island park on the Detroit

[Detroit Historical Museum](#)



What is it? Home to bite-size exhibitions showcasing the city's rich 300-year history.

Why go? The Detroit Historical Museum details vital moments in the making of the Motor City and Old Detroit, but it's the ever-evolving temporary exhibits that keep people flocking to this quaint Midtown institution. In particular, the displays focusing on the city's rich artistic heritage, which is often unjustly left for dust by its automotive accomplishments.



Motown Historical Museum

What is it? Music legends were made in this modest Detroit house.

Why go? At 2648 West Grand Blvd you'll find Hitsville USA. In other words, the home of Motown Records, which was founded by Berry Gordy in 1959 in this very house. Many greats recorded here, including Marvin Gaye, The Supremes and Stevie Wonder, while other legends have contributed to the museum. Paul McCartney helped fund the restoration of Motown's 1877 Steinway & Sons grand piano, which you can see in all its glory, and Michael Jackson donated a hat, glove and

thousands of dollars. Whether you're a music nut or not, the Motown Museum is a must-see.

The RiverWalk



What is it? A 5.5-mile promenade unfurling alongside the city's spectacular waterfront.

Why go? The RiverWalk boasts outstanding views of the Detroit River beyond. During the summer months it offers a cooler place to exercise than the heat of the city, with locals flocking in their thousands to run, walk or cycle its picturesque course. There are plenty of way stations en route too: for eating, drinking and bike/kayak renting. For those visiting for the first time, there are also free RiverWalk tours given by the

excellent [Detroit Experience Factory](#).



Henry Ford Museum of American Innovation

What is it? A look at Detroit's industrial and cultural past.

Why go? They don't call Detroit the Motor City for nothing. Widely considered the centre of America's automotive industry, it's here that Henry Ford birthed the idea of manufacturing affordable cars via an assembly line. Learn about that and more at Henry Ford's sprawling museum. Visitors can see the limousine in which JFK was assassinated, the bus on which Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat and behind-

the-scenes at the Rouge Factory, which is still in operation today.

Eastern Market



What is it? A one-stop, six-block shop of foodie heaven.

Why go? As the largest historic market in the country, Eastern Market covers an enormous 43 acres, selling pretty much every kind of food imaginable—as well as hosting the largest open-air flowerbed market in the US. It can get very busy—some 45,000 people come here every Saturday—so if you need a breather, head to the [Russell Street Deli](#), where a delicious breakfast menu is served all day, including their famous fresh hotcakes with toasted pecans and maple syrup.

Detroit Theater District



What is it? The second largest theatre district in America (after Broadway).

Why go? Many of Detroit's theaters can be found in grand, historic buildings. Like the [Opera House](#), an ornate structure that parts of which were designed by Charles Howard Crane and date back to 1906. Crane also designed [Fox Theatre](#)'s original flagship 'movie palace', which opened in 1928 and remains today. Also worth a visit is the quirky, cabaret-style [Century Theatre](#) (located inside Gem Theatre), which is especially good for comedy.



Campus Martius Park

What is it? The 'point of origin' of Detroit's coordinate system (seven miles north is Seven Mile Rd, another mile then Eight Mile Rd, etc.).

Why go? Campus Martius Park remains one of the city's most important focal points. It's also one of the best places to hang out for a chilled afternoon: Relax with a specialty coffee from Roasting Plant (and marvel at their [Javabot](#)), or go for a spin round the seasonal ice rink and enjoy a hot cup of cocoa in the colder months.

Detroit Institute of Arts



What is it? A prime art collection, including pieces by Picasso, Matisse and Van Gogh.

Why go? Justifiably renowned worldwide, the Detroit Institute of Arts' coup de grace is 'Rivera Court'; an entire room of outstanding frescoes painted in situ by Mexican artist Diego Rivera during a visit in 1932 with his wife Frida Kahlo. Visit on a Friday evening, when the museum stays open until 10pm and Rivera Court hosts free concerts. And if that's not

enough for your artistic appetite, there's also the [Museum of Contemporary Art Detroit](#), which you'll find in a former Albert Kahn auto dealership.

Charles H. Wright African American Museum



Why go? This large museum, named for its founder Charles Wright, tells the story of the African American experience from the beginning of time to the presidency of Barack Obama. Opened in 1965, the museum welcomes guests to its 125,000 square feet of both permanent and rotating exhibits, as well as a library and theater.

Comerica Park



Why go? If you're not much of a baseball fan, this ballpark – home field for the Detroit Tigers – is for you. While diehard fans are glued to their seats in hopes of catching a fly ball, casual onlookers can enjoy some of the park's more unusual attractions, including a carousel, a 50-foot Ferris wheel, a beer hall, a food court, plus a center field water feature that's synchronized to music. Perhaps it's these unique diversions that earned Detroit a spot on the list of [10 Best Cities for Baseball Fans to Visit](#).

Detroit Zoo



Why go? Many recent travelers called the Detroit Zoo one of the city's best family attractions. Spread out across 125 acres and boasting more than 2,400 animals, the zoo has a longstanding history in Detroit (it's been open since 1928). Of the zoo's 12 habitats, perhaps the most popular among recent visitors is the Polk Penguin Conservation Center, which debuted in 2016. This 326,000-gallon, 25-foot-deep aquatic area allows zoo visitors to observe more than 80 penguins of four different species explore their habitat. Plus, thanks to an underwater gallery with two tunnels, visitors can see the birds above, around and below.

RESTAURANTS



Asking where you should eat in Detroit is a lot like figuring out who the best Motown singer was. Marvin Gaye? The Supremes? Stevie Wonder when he was the most talented child on Earth? There are a lot of options to choose from, but luckily that's where we come in.

Here's our guide to where the Great Awakening Hebrews to Negroes Mega Conference compiled of our favorite places to eat and drink across the Motor City. It includes everything from the city's best coney dogs to where to get Thai food and barbecue in Corktown, along with some great group dinner options in between. Are you sitting on a friend's couch and are suddenly overrun with the urge to eat delicious chicken wings? Hear us out - you should go to Sweetwater. What we're trying to say is that Sweetwater Tavern has excellent wings and it's the main reason we keep going back to this downtown classic. The ribs, rib tips, burgers, and general bar food are also all good, in case this is the one time in your life when you don't in fact want wings.

But one coney dog isn't enough, so your standard order is two up with everything, chili cheese fries, and a cold beer. Don't be shy if you need a third coney, or consider ordering a slice of their sneaky good pie.

This local chain has since opened 12 locations across Detroit, meaning you can get your fix of the rectangular, thick crust pan pies wherever you are in town. If this is your first time visiting, make sure to stop at Buddy's.

WHAT TO BRING TO THE CONFERENCE?

Great Awakening Hebrews to Negroes Mega Conference is a busy, thrilling few days. Among meeting Hebrews from across the country, participating in sessions and forums, you will be making friends, participating in unforgettable events, and creating new memories. - Pack sunglasses and sunscreen. Although we will be in air-conditioned rooms and inside most of the day, Detroit will be hot and humid.
- Hygiene Essentials. This is separate from what you leave in your hotel bathroom. Bring a small brush, some make up, hand sanitizer (you will be amongst crowds of strangers in small breakout rooms) and any other necessary item to freshen up halfway through the day. 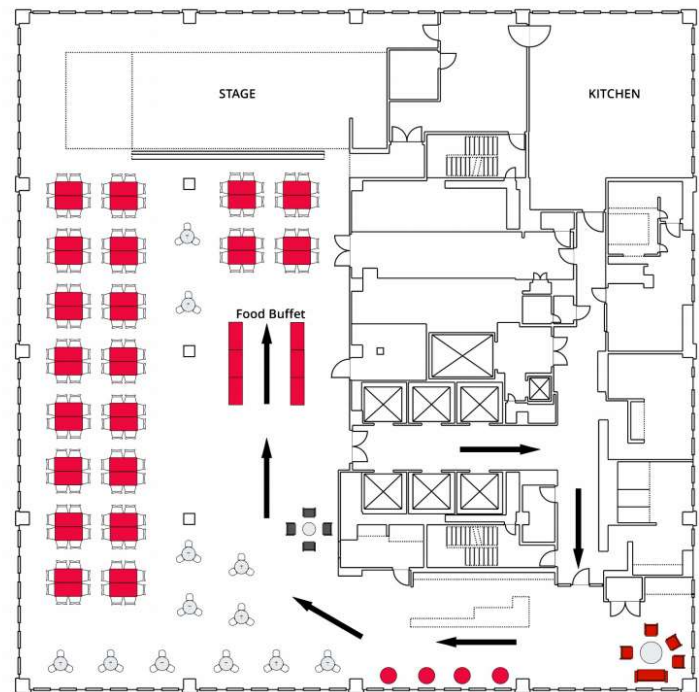

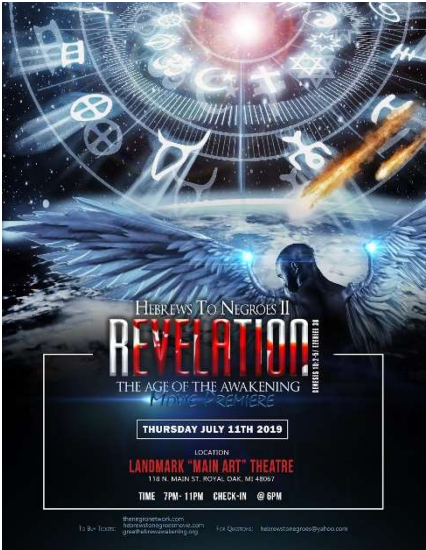

From that day on, Yah would reveal to Ronald in bits and pieces, the truth about the lost heritage of black people in America as it pertained to the ancient Hebrew Israelites of the Bible. Concurrently, he began assembling an educational documentary presented on DVD that featured historical images, charts, facts and ancient quotes to support his message. He titled the DVD and book: "Hebrews to Negroes: Wake Up Black America". This initial effort would eventually spawn three additional books, with accompanying DVDs, a podcast show, and in 2018, the debut of a highly-acclaimed feature film. Shortly after this, Ronald produced the Theatrical Movie "Hebrews to Negroes: Wake Up Black America" which premiered at the Landmark "Main Art" Theater in the Detroit Metropolitan Area on December 20, 2018 in front of a crowd of 450 people. Today, Ronald enjoys touring the United States with his Hebrews to Negroes Movie Tour teaching and enlightening others on real biblical truth.



Dr. Kenneth Howard is a community activists, pastor, professor, prolific motivational speaker, visionary, businessman, and community leader. He holds an Associates and Bachelor of Science from Ferris State

University. 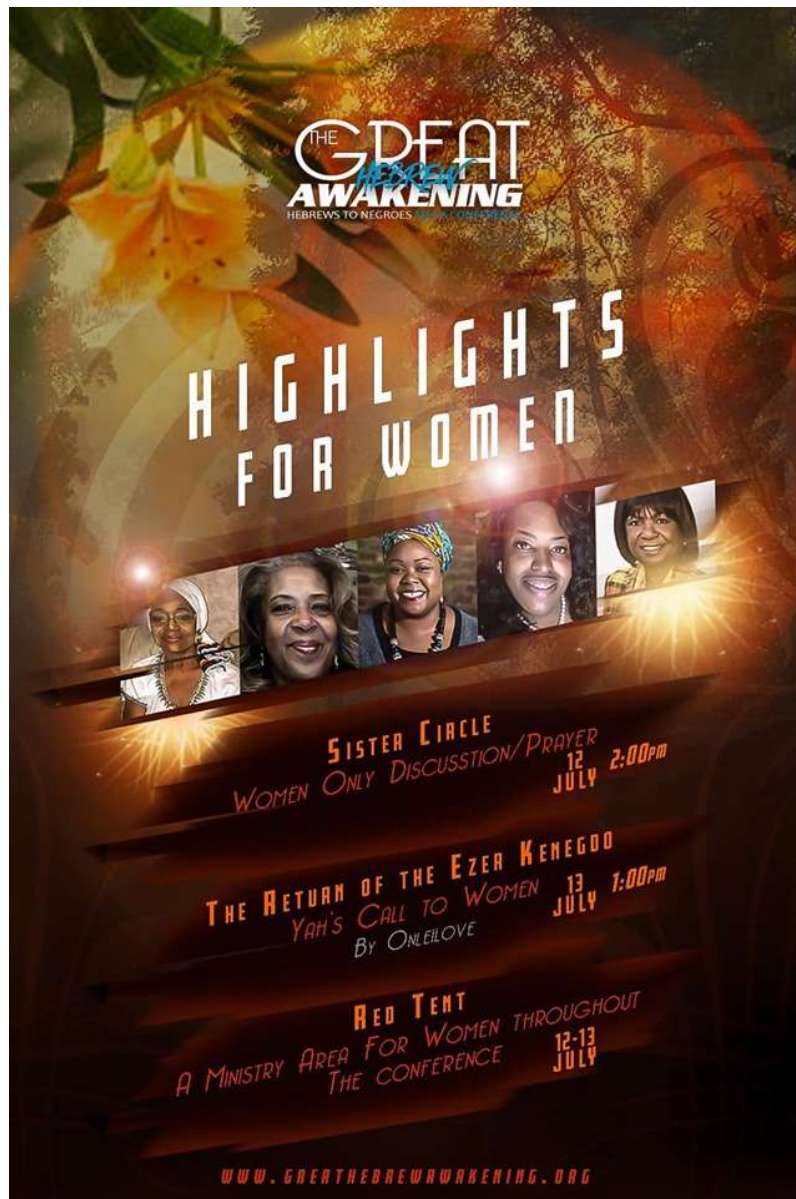

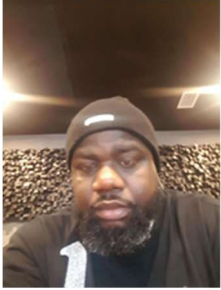


Dennis Witherspoon

14. Hebrew Unsung Educator Award - which honors that individual whose teachings, influence, ideals, skills, and ministry have been devoted unselfishly to serve the best interests of the Hebrew Faith.
15. Hebrew Matriarch Award – is given to a elder mother in the Hebrew Community who’s life has transcended the limitations placed on them. It is given out of pure respect for the honoree and our devotion to our mothers. It is an award of strength in that we acknowledge that the honoree has allowed the younger generations to stand on their shoulders and reconnect to their Hebrew heritage. And it is an award of love, in that love is the purest form is admiration and admiration is the closest expression of Yah’s happiness.
16. Hebrew Character Award - which is intended for that person who truly makes an exceptional difference in the Hebrew Community, making decisions for the betterment of the Faith, not solely for personal gain.
17. Hebrew Leadership Award – recognizes a leader in the Hebrew community that demonstrates visionary leadership expressed through an ability to imagine what the Hebrew community could look like and the steps for getting there; effective leadership

that leads to impact within the Hebrew community; authentic leadership that shows a strong sense of purpose, as well as true engagement with the Hebrew community; and transformational leadership inspired by innovative thinking and a willingness to take risks to achieve Kingdom results.

18. Hebraic Woman of the Year – recognize and to honor an extraordinary woman in the Hebrew Faith who have demonstrated a commitment to leadership, spiritual development, community service and academic excellence in the Hebrew Community.
19. Hebrew Man of the Year Award – recognizes a Hebrew man who has made broad significant achievements and contributions to the Hebrew Community this year and has exemplified those traits, which set him above other leaders.

Directions to the Parking Garage at COBO ROOFTOP DECK and to the Boat

If you want to use your GPS, we recommend using the addresses. For the parking garage: 625 West Congress St. Detroit, Michigan. For the boat dock: 1 Civic Center Dr, Detroit, Michigan. The directions below are quicker and easier to use.

I-94/Westbound I-94/ Eastbound I-96, Northbound I-75, Southbound I-75 and I-10 South: These directions are for parking:

Take your selected freeway toward downtown, stay on your freeway until you see signs for I-375 South. The easiest and fastest way is to stay on your freeway until you get to I-375 South freeway. Take I-375 all the way into the city. I-375 becomes Jefferson West. Move over into the right two lanes and take Jefferson until it dead ends into Cobo Hall Conference Center. Turn right onto Washington Blvd then immediately turn left on to Congress St. Stay in the right lane on Congress and proceed to the entrance to the Cobo Rooftop garage which is at 625 West Congress.

Once on the roof, park as close as you can to the river. There is an elevator that will take you down to the river and you will see the boat to your left as you walk out the doors of Cobo Hall.

These directions are for dropping guests off at the boat before parking

Use the same directions as above except once on Jefferson you will need to do a U-turn at Washington Blvd then immediately turn right on to Bates Street. Once on Bates take next right on to the riverfront. You will pass under Hart Plaza. The boat is on your left after you exit the tunnel.

Once you have dropped off your guests you proceed back the way you came to Jefferson. You need to do a Michigan left on Jefferson. Once you have turned left move to the right two lanes and proceed toward Cobo Hall. Turn right at Cobo on to Washington Blvd then left onto Congress. Stay in the right lane and proceed to Cobo Rooftop Parking. Once on the roof park all the way toward the river, there is an elevator that will take you down to the river and you will see the boat to your left as you walk out the doors of Cobo Hall.

LAKE BAPTISM IN THE DETROIT RIVER

Congratulations on your decision to get baptized during the Great Awakening Hebrews to Negroes Mega Conference! This serves as your confirmation letter for your upcoming baptism.

Being water baptized is a natural step of obedience to the scriptures. Acts 2:38 commands us to "Repent and be baptized". Your decision to be baptized in water is an act of obedience to this instruction the Bible has given us. It is an outward testimony of the internal change that has taken place in the awakened Hebrew life. Through water baptism, we identify with Mashiach's death, burial, and resurrection not just in a moment, but as a way of living.

By participating in this lake baptism at Belle Isle Park in Detroit, MI you are publicly declaring the decision you have made to be a follower of Mashiach.

To be baptized is to follow Mashiach in obedience. Please remember that baptism will not save anyone. In fact, the only requirement for baptism is that you have already trusted Yahshua/Yahusha/Yahushua/Yahawashi as your personal Mashiach. This is a big step in the Awakening for you. To be baptized in the name of the Messiah's true name is direct obedience to the scriptures. It is the very first step in obedience to Yah after being forgiven of your sins.

Baptism is a celebration of what Yah has done in the life of a Mashiach follower. The Scriptures teaches us that followers of the Mashiach are to be baptized and that it is one of the first steps in this lifelong journey of discipleship.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR WATER BAPTISM CANDIDATES

As you take this incredible step in the Awakening process, here are some instructions for your upcoming baptism:

1. **Invite Everyone:** Remember to Invite all of your Friends and Family. This is a time of celebration for what Yah has done in your life. This is also one of the few times you will have friends and family who are completely focused on and how the Awakening has changed your life. Scripture tells us to "Make the most of every opportunity when dealing with unbelievers" and to "Always be ready to give a reason for the hope that you have." With this in mind, we try to be very intentional about sharing your testimonies and the awakening with our guests. Please invite them all.
2. **Arrive Early: On Sunday July 14, 2019** please arrive at **Belle Isle Park Beach by 8:00am**. This way you can be relaxed, and ready to go. Arriving at 6:00am will give us time to walk through the logistics before the baptism begins. We will show you the lake (Detroit River), talk through how things will work, and answer any questions you may have. You will have a chance during your baptism to answer a question about why you want to be baptized. We will discuss this with you beforehand so that you know what to expect and are comfortable with the process.
3. **During Baptism:** Here is the process for the actual physical immersion in water.
 - We will help you step into the lake (Detroit River).
 - One of our Baptizers will stand to one side of you, usually to your left.
 - You are encouraged to plug your nose and put other hand on your chest or arm.
 - Our Baptizers will put one hand on your back and the other on your arm or hand.
 - Our Baptizers will hold you as you are dunked.
 - You need to lean backwards into the water with the baptizer's support until you are completely under water. Just relax and lean back, and then the baptizer will help you sit back up.
 - While you are being baptized, the baptizer will say something along these lines: "We say the following: "In obedience to the command of our Mashiach and based upon the profession of your faith, I now baptize you in the Name and in the authority of Yahusha/Yahshua/Yahawashi." Buried with Mashiach [immerse in water], Raised to walk in new life [emerge from water]."
 - Feel free to express your joy, look out at your friends, wave at your family, and cheer if you want. Just be yourself. This is a community celebration, so feel free to celebrate with your friends, family, and hundreds of Hebrews on sight.

- After your baptism, we will help you step out of the river, and a helper will hand you and towel and help you out of the Lake so that you can go and change your clothes.
4. **All candidates, male and female, are required to bring the following:**
 - a. For women, Capri or lightweight pants and a neutral color T-shirt.
 - b. For men, appropriate swimwear and a neutral color T-shirt.
 - c. Please wear appropriate clothing that won't be harmed by getting wet.
 - d. Keep in mind how the material will look on you when it is wet, so you can take the necessary steps to be modest at all times (no white t-shirts!).
 - e. Bring a light jacket as temperatures can be quite cool early in the morning in Michigan.
 - f. Beach Towel.
 - g. Change of clothes.
 - h. Women in their menstrual cycle should take proper precautions as far as utilizing hygienic items.
 - i. Bathing cap (optional).
 5. **Be in Prayer:** Be in prayer asking Yah to speak through you and that you would share your testimony of how He has changed your life.
 6. **Be Prepared to Share:** Be prepared to give brief answers to the following questions:
 - A. How do you describe the feeling of being baptized in the true name of the Messiah?
 - B. How the Awakening has changed your life?

BAPTISM OF THE RUACH

After you have been baptized in water in the Detroit River at the Belle Isle Beach, **Pastors Melvin and Andrea Rhines of Minnesota, MN** will be facilitating Baptism in the Ruach for those who desire this experience. **This is optional for baptism candidates.** The filling of the Ruach (Holy Spirit) is how He empowers and controls us (Acts 4:31; Ephesians 5:18). The indwelling of the Holy Spirit is Yah taking up permanent residence in our lives (John 14:17; Romans 8:9-11; 1 Corinthians 3:16; 6:19; 1 John 4:4). The sealing of the Ruach (Holy Spirit) is Yah marking us as His permanent possession (Ephesians 1:13-14).

Baptism in the Ruach (Holy Spirit) does two things. First, it identifies us spiritually with the death and resurrection of Mashiach, uniting us with Him. Second, baptism in the Ruach (Holy Spirit) joins us to the body of Mashiach, and identifies us as united with other believers. Practically, baptism in the Ruach (Holy Spirit) means we are risen with Him to newness of life (Romans 6:4), and that we should exercise our spiritual gifts to keep the body of Mashiach functioning properly as stated in 1 Corinthians 12:13. Experiencing baptism in the Ruach (Holy Spirit) serves as an exhortation to keep unity of the assembly (Ephesians 4:5). Being identified with Mashiach in His death, burial, and resurrection-through baptism in the Ruach (Holy Spirit) establishes the basis for realizing our separation from the power of indwelling sin and our walk in newness of life (Romans 6:1-10, Colossians 2:12).

If you have a physical challenge, please inform us in advance. This will enable us to properly accommodate you. All candidates are encouraged to invite family and friends to attend the ceremony. Cameras and phones with cams are also welcomed. All candidates who pre-registered for baptism will receive an official **Baptism Certificate in the mail for keepsake.**

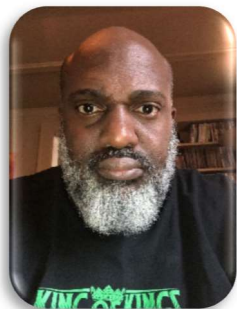

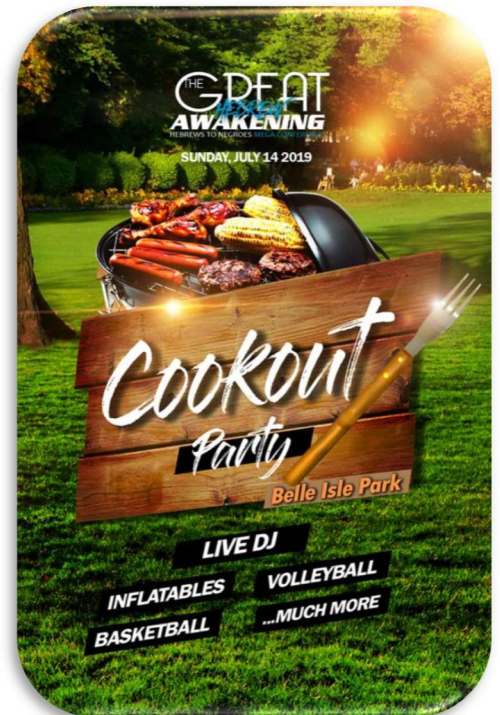

BELLE ISLE PARK

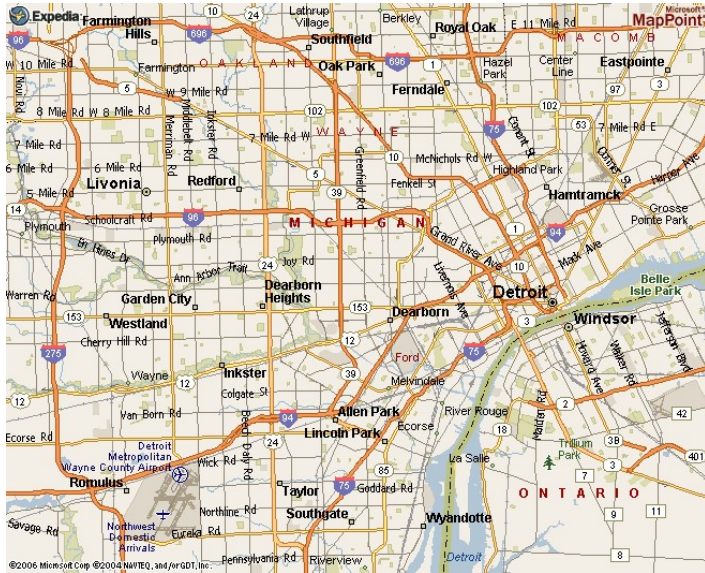


BELLE ISLE PARK

Belle Isle Park is a 2.5-mile-long, 982-acre island park, located in the international waters of the Detroit River. Inspired by renowned landscape architect Frederick Law Olmsted's design in the 1880s, the park was created to provide an urban oasis in Detroit. Affectionately named the "Jewel of Detroit", Belle Isle has significant natural, architectural, and cultural resources. Almost one third of the island is a natural wooded area that is home to a wide variety of small animals and birds. The park features a number of historic public landmarks including the Belle Isle Aquarium, Belle Isle Casino, Anna Scripps Whitcomb Conservatory, Dossin Great Lakes Museum, and the James Scott Memorial Fountain.

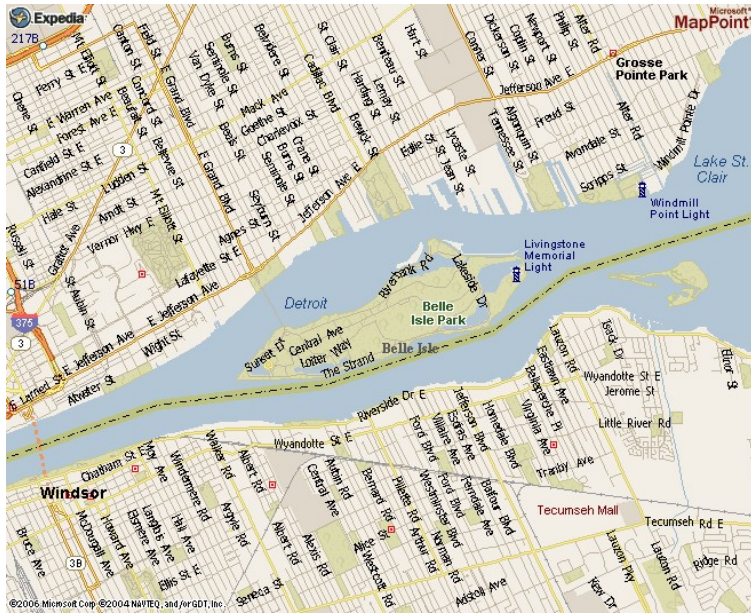
GETTING TO THE PARK

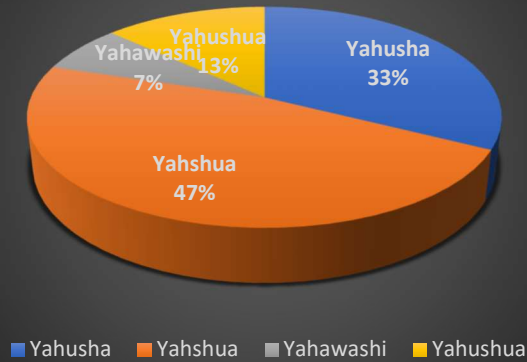

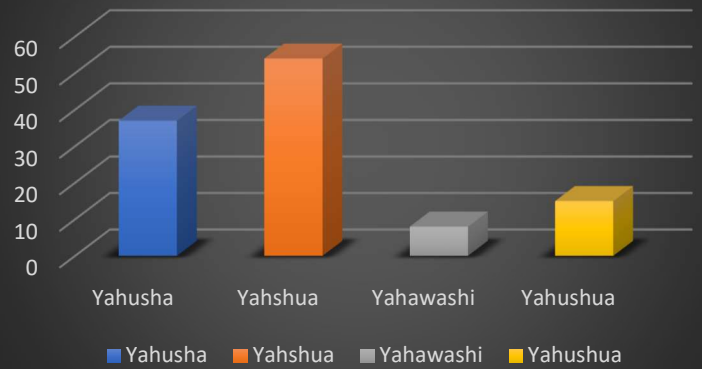

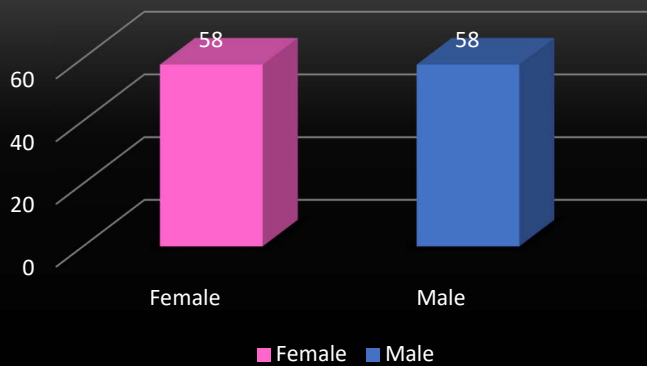
Great Awakening Baptism



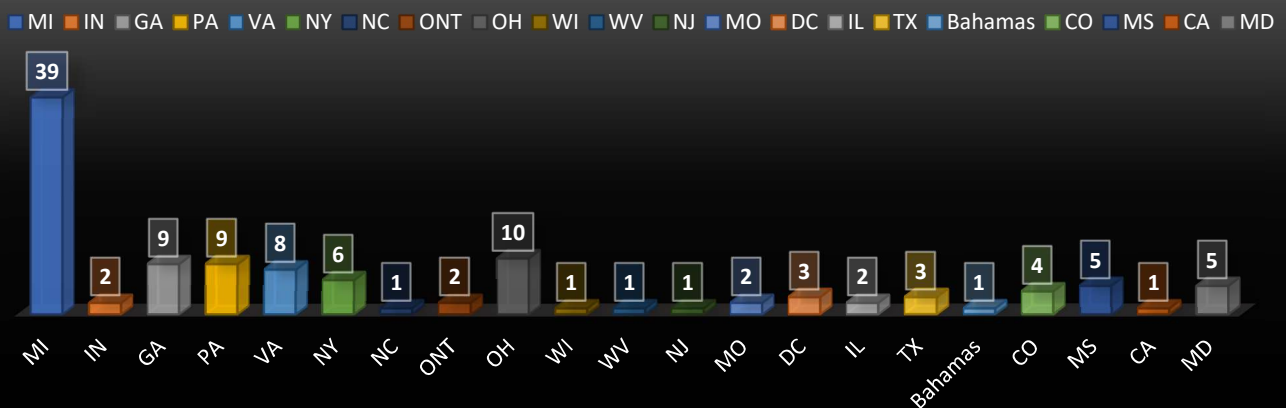
Great Awakening Baptism



Great Awakening Baptism by Gender

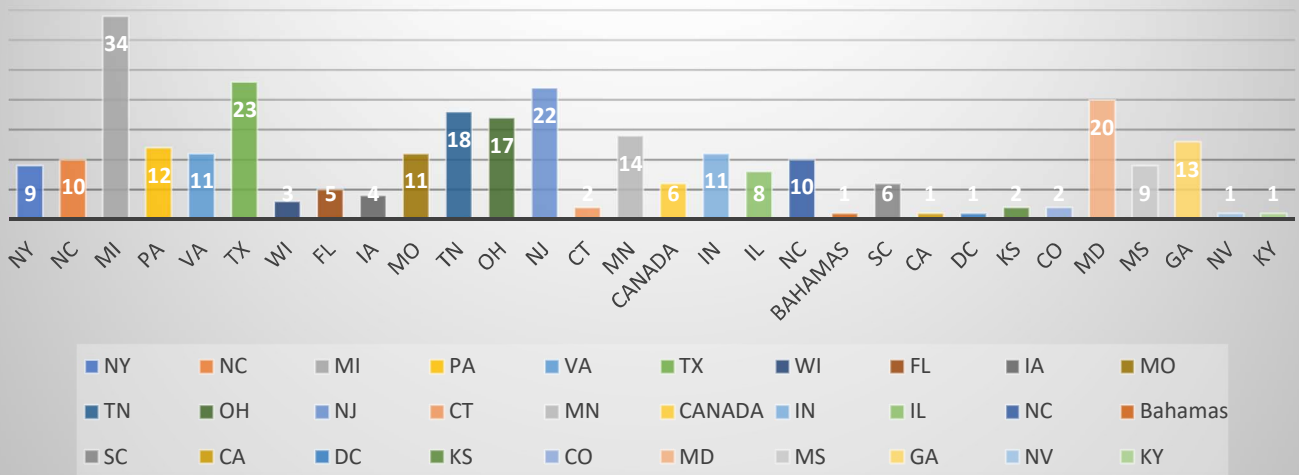


GREAT AWAKENING BAPTISM BY STATE

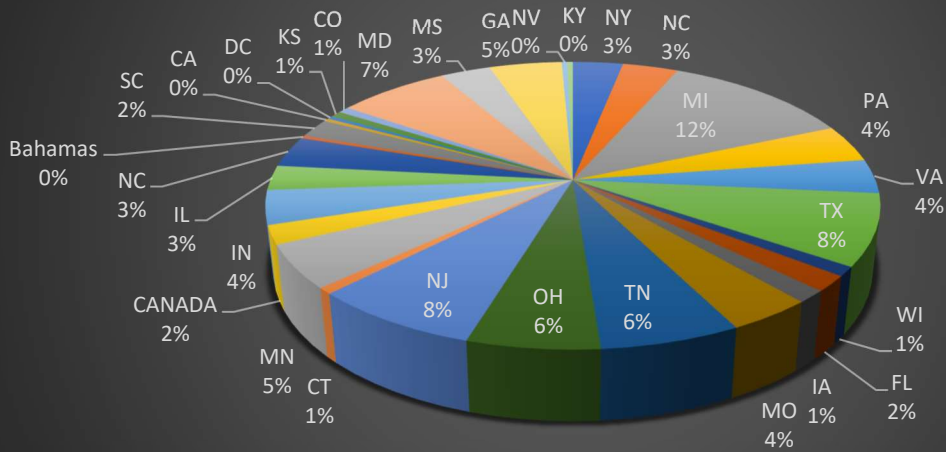

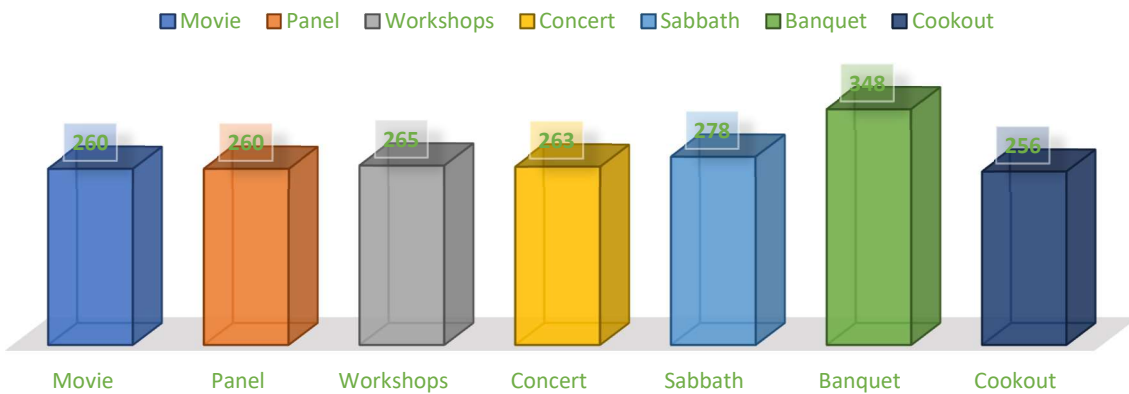
Great Awakening Registration by State

VOLUNTEERS

Greetings from the Great Awakening Hebrew to Negroes Mega Conference! We are excited as we finish up details for the Conference and look forward to working with volunteers throughout Metro Detroit Area. As you can imagine, the number of volunteers needed for a conference as large as The Great Awakening Hebrew to Negroes Mega Conference is great. There are **25 subcommittees** that will all be responsible for specific volunteers, as described this packet.

Sub-Committees

- 1. Convention Center Greeters** - Volunteers will welcome guests at the COBO Center as well as directing traffic within the Convention Center from Thursday morning through Sunday evening. **Volunteers Needed: 3**
- 2. Sidewalk Greeters** - Volunteers will be stationed at the Downtown Core and on sidewalks near the nexus of Conference activities from Friday morning until Saturday evening. **Volunteers Needed: 2**
- 3. Hotel Lobby Greeters** - Volunteers will staff information tables in hotel lobbies in downtown Detroit hotel sites from Thursday morning until Saturday evening. **Volunteers Needed: 4**
- 4. Registration** - Some of these volunteers will staff the registration area in Landmark Theatre and COBO Center. They may provide badge holders and information packets to those who are pre-registered. Others may staff the information tables for questions about the Conference. Management of online registration and payments, Management of speaker and guest room assignments, creation of attendee badges, Creation and maintenance of a master check-in list, Creation/compilation of attendee package: bags, maps, t-shirts, program booklet, and lanyard. Managing conference on-site registration and information tables, Updates to attendees leading up to conference Attendee tracking (room numbers). A third set of volunteers may assist the professional firm handling on-site registration. **Volunteers Needed: 6**
- 5. Shuttle Bus Drivers/Greeters** – Volunteers who possess a Chauffers’ license will be driving and picking up and dropping off guests who have pre-registered for the Shuttle Service. Other volunteers will be stationed at shuttle bus service drop-off and pickup points at peak hours from Thursday morning to Sunday early afternoon to help all Convention attendees using Bus Services to and from hotels, the Convention Center and Belle Isle Park. **Volunteers Needed:4**
- 6. Accessibilities** - These volunteers will be a source of information for physically challenged and other individuals who feel the need for additional support. **Volunteers Needed: 1**

- 7. Transportation Hub Greeters** - These volunteers will greet our visitors at the airport, train stations, and bus depots. They will guide them toward transportation to their local destinations. **Volunteers Needed: N/A**
- 8. Hebrew Kidz:** This team is responsible to plan and coordinate the Hebrew Kidz Workshops, which includes 4 age groups: Elementary (Pre-K – 2), Elementary (Grades 3-5), Middle School (Grades 6-8), High School (Grades 9-12). A minimum of 2 volunteers are need per age group. Volunteers are responsible for ministry plans, decorations, child registration, entrance and exit, games and activities, gospel presentation, and recovery area for lost children. In addition, this team is responsible to procure needed equipment and supplies. **Volunteers Needed: 6**
- 9. Food Preparation:** Volunteers will help prepare, cook, and serve Breakfast and Lunch items during Conference. This team is responsible for setup, breakdown, and cleanup of food areas. **Volunteers Needed: 6**
- 10. Volunteer Kick-Off Meeting & Training Orientation** - Volunteers will help set up and organize the official start of the Great Hebrew Awakening Hebrew to Negroes Mega Conference Volunteer activities. The goal of the Kick-Off Meeting is to provide information about the volunteer process and to sign up volunteers for the various subcommittees. The Training is the orientation meeting for volunteers. **Volunteers Needed: 3**
- 11. Arrangements:** The Arrangements team is responsible to obtain much of the equipment and supplies needed for the conference. This includes fence, stages, sound systems, tables, chairs, tents, electrical power, trash cans, and more. In addition, this team is responsible to recruit site setup and cleanup volunteers and oversee all site setup and cleanup responsibilities. **Volunteers Needed: 6**
- 12. Guide Guests:** Assist moving conference attendees into the main general session area in a timely manner for sessions by asking people to please take their seats – assisting anyone who may need assistance finding a seat. **Volunteers Needed: 2**
- 13. Shadows:** these volunteers will be assigned to one of our guest speakers. They are responsible for meeting the assigned speaker at the Hotel and provide a welcoming atmosphere to the Conference. They are responsible for ensuring conference guests and speakers are well fed and taken care of, ground transportation, carrying their bags and miscellaneous items, ensuring that guest speakers eat breakfast and lunch, and creating a welcoming and helpful environment, downtown Detroit tour guides, on-site welcome, and more for guest speakers. **Volunteers Needed: 10**
- 14. Musical Concert:** They are responsible for ensuring musical guests are well fed and taken care of, arranging sound check opportunities, carrying their bags and miscellaneous items, ensuring that artists are accommodated for, and creating a welcoming and helpful environment,. **Volunteers Needed: 4**

- 15. Marketing and Promotional:** Responsible for developing and implementing marketing initiatives and activities to increase awareness of the conference to attract attendees, assemblies, and ministries; seek corporate entities that are interested in supporting the Conference; developing compelling and innovative promotional and marketing materials in order to enhance attendance at the Awakening Conference. **Volunteers Needed: 4**
- 16. Cruise/Award Banquet Committee:** responsible for organizing the Cruise of the All-White Cruise on the Detroit River, sale tickets for the event, compile guest list, secure Jazz Band/DJ, organize dinner selections with guests, manage registration for this event and arrange decorations. This Committee formally recognizes the excellence and contributions of people in the Hebrew awakening movement through the bestowal of a variety of awards and evaluate nominees for each of these awards. **Volunteers Needed: 4**
- 17. Vendors Committee:** responsible for creating a package for reaching out to potential vendors, tracking document weekly and updates on vendor selection, provide selected vendors with the conference agenda, booth location, set up timing and details, and other relevant information, schedule meetings with vendors to answer any question they have on set up logistics, on the day of the event, walking around the vendor area and talk with vendors to ensure they have everything they need, secure a target of twenty (20) paying vendors that are relevant to the conference theme and purpose. **Volunteers Needed: 3**
- 18. Family Cookout:** responsible for planning and organizing the Family Cookout that gives Conference attendees, their families, and the guests an opportunity to fellowship in a fun, safe, and relaxed atmosphere. Responsible for planning and organizing the Conference Cookout; selects the location and theme and entertainment for the Cookout; decide what type of food, the cost of the food and supplies should be figured into the per person cost; reserving the location and making the deposit if one is required; give report of the day's activity to include expenses, theme, all costs, attendance and other information that will detail the Cookout activities. **Volunteers Needed: 10**
- 19. Conference/Workshop:** responsible for selecting the site for the Conference workshops; work out contract details with the selected site; contact and coordinate with the Speakers; prepares documents, copies and materials for all Conference workshops; attend to details leading up to the workshop; attend to details on the day of the workshop; work out the speaker's contract details with the selected speakers; recommends the theme of the Conference, develops a budget and manages the program portion of the overall conference budget; identifies the speakers for the Conference and makes recommendations to the Host Committee on program format; facilitate speaker arrangements; responsible for corresponding with the speakers in order to obtain pictures and biographies, to keep the speakers informed of the progress of the program, to identify speaker requirements and to assist the speakers, if needed, with transportation and accommodations, meeting room setups and audiovisual needs. **Volunteers Needed: N/A**

- 20. Community Service:** responsible for providing ways in which conference attendees can provide ministry to and give back to the Detroit area; responsible for organizing and overseeing the community service project of the Conference. Planning, scheduling and executing the community service events. Promoting and ensuring a safe and respectful environment for all service events attendees are involved in that day (ie food pantry giveaway; cleaning up blighted areas, tutoring/literacy projects, road-side cleanup projects; etc.) **Volunteers Needed: 10**
- 21. Unity Prayer Coordinator:** responsible for identifying key attendees who will be willing to pray during the one-hour Sabbath Morning Unity Intercessory Prayer event. Responsible for uniting all attendees to pray collectively and fervently for Yah to break through in new and miraculous ways. To organize a prayer initiative, during the conference, that fuels the atmosphere of possibility, and the entire focus begins to shift from inward to up-and-outward. **Volunteers Needed: 3**
- 22. Movie/Hebrew Forum:** responsible for organizing the registration tables at the Movie Premier. Responsible with organizing the structure of the forum and panel, choose moderator, select and invite panelists, select theme, create relevant questions, and develop strategies to engage the audience. Responsible for securing a stage, tables, chairs, lighting, microphone, and sound equipment necessary for the Forum. **Volunteers Needed: 2**
- 23. Baptism:** responsible for making sure that all necessary baptismal equipment is available and ready prior to each baptismal service on the last day of the Conference. Develop a list of candidates and notify candidates for baptism well in advance of the scheduled baptism at Belle Isle Park. Arrange with and candidates for a period of instruction regarding the baptism. Prepare name tags of candidates for identification purposes. Assure supplies such as towels, baptismal robes, plastic bags for wet clothing, white attire for those who forget to bring one, male and female grooming accessories, and plastic baskets for wet towels and robes available. Give candidate an official record of baptisms. Perform necessary cleanup after the baptism. **Volunteers Needed: 10**
- 24. Social Media:** responsible for helping us to spread the word about all the great happenings at The Great Awakening Hebrew to Negroes Conference! If you're an avid Tweeter, Facebooker, Instagramer this area is for you. These volunteers must be experienced "Tweeters" who are knowledgeable about tweeting protocol and Twitter best practices (use of hash tags, re-tweeting and attribution, etc.). 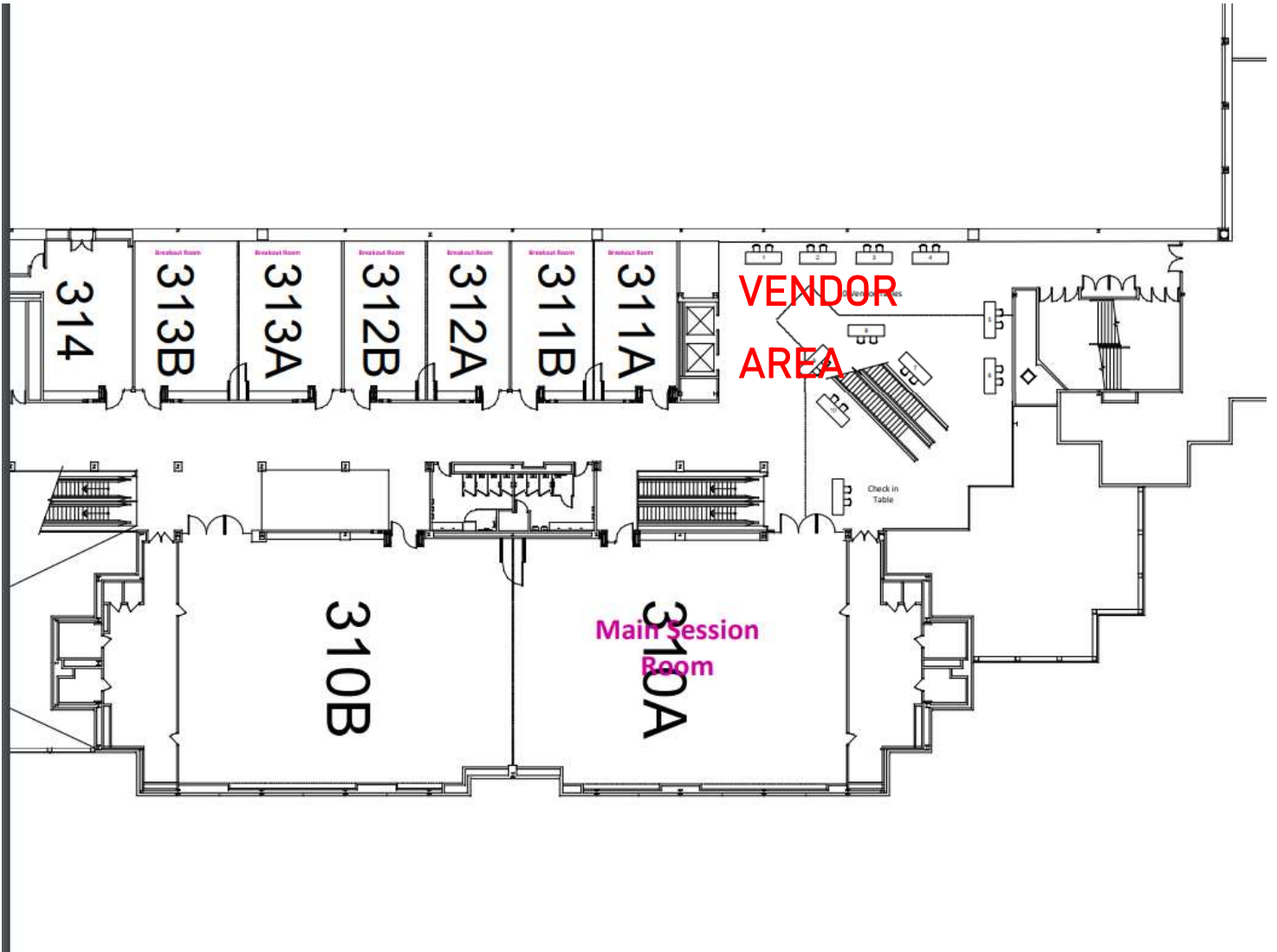
